Death – Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for teens.

Seatbelt – In 2007 alone, seat belts saved an estimated 15,147 lives.

Speed – Slow down and drive the speed limit. You'll get where you're going faster without a ticket or a crash.

Alcohol – Almost 12,000 people were killed last year in crashes involving drunk drivers.

Tires – Keeping your vehicle maintained will help keep you safe on the road.

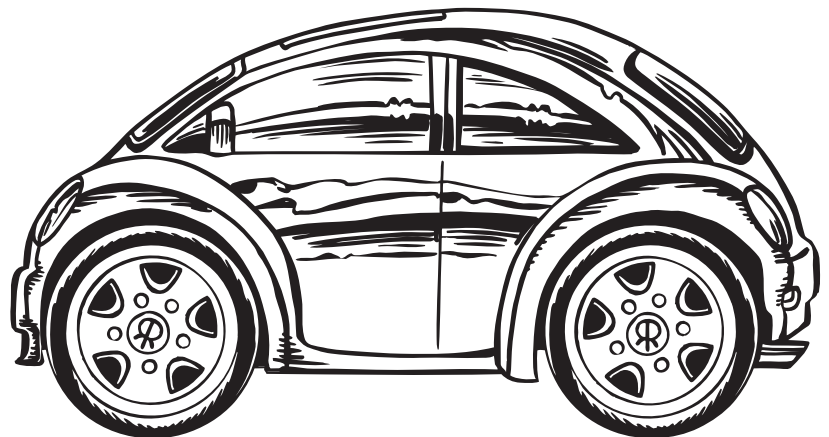
Safe – Play it safe. Teens are involved in **3 times as many fatal crashes** as all other drivers.

Friends – Protect your friends. Two out of three teens that die as passengers are in vehicles driven by other teens.

Cell – Give the road your full attention. Pull over if you need to talk or text.

Car – Driving a car is a big responsibility. Take it seriously.

Buckle – In 2007, 61 percent of teens killed in motor vehicle crashes were not buckled up.
